

Excellence in Education: The new Micro-Credential in Sustainable Business was approved April 18, 2023, by the provost, for starting in the Fall 2023 term. This replaces the Sustainable Business Certificate, the new micro-credential is available to all Pitt Graduate Students and those eligible to take Graduate courses (e.g., Professionals). It guides students on how companies manage their social (people), environmental (planet), and financial (profits) risks, obligations, and opportunities to positively impact both stakeholders and financial well-being. Those who have previously completed a bachelor's degree as well as current Pitt graduate students are eligible to apply.

GREEN OFFICE OAK TREE

The CSB has been a Green Office Sapling for several years but we recently implemented changes and have achieved Oak Tree status, the highest rating for green offices on Pitt's campus meeting 75-100% of possible total points. We analyzed our energy usage, food waste, office supply use, transportation methods, purchasing choices, engagement methods, equity, and staff health & wellbeing.

FOOD WASTE REDUCTION

We created new guidelines for both ordering food and a CSB Food Waste Plan as a staff guide for event planning to ensure we are accurately ordering for our events and minimizing waste.

GIVING TO THE GREEN FUND

All of our speakers receive a Voltaic backpack made of recycled plastic with a solar panel. When guests respectfully declining this gift, we donated the cost to the Pitt Green Fund, an organization that funds student led sustainability projects on campus.

EVENT GHG EMISSION REDUCTIONS


Our event baseline - SBF Spring 2023 indicates that we're generating 5 lbs. CO2e per USD spent on the event. The latest IPCC Report suggests our ceiling per transaction should be 1 lb. of CO2 per dollar; and moving -12 lb. per dollar would make us a regenerative organization. We're currently exploring options - preferably local - to inset emissions reductions in addition to programmatic changes to emit less.
